- Attend a training session for volunteers (Oct. 14-15, 2011).
- Work collaboratively with community residents, community organizations, and the Planned Parenthood Community Action Boards.
- Be responsible for overseeing all volunteer recruitment, conducting volunteer orientations/training, and overall community/campus outreach.
- Stay updated with each respective campus' RJA, knowing when parties and fundraising events are occurring, and serve as the liaison between the RJA's, PPIN, and community partners.
- Complete a monthly report and check in weekly with the Community Organizer of Planned Parenthood of Indiana.
- Report to the Director of Activism of Planned Parenthood of Indiana.
- Support PPIN's mission, goals, and policies.
- Strictly adhere to our confidentiality policy at all times.

1. Describe your involvement with other community groups, extra-curricular activities, or special projects you have worked on in the last year. Be specific, we want to know what you think and how you feel about these activities.
2. What do you think are the most important issues affecting youth today? Be as specific as possible and provide one idea that could be a potential solution to the issue you have identified.
